

Community mobilization

- Community mobilization is a process for reaching out to different sectors of a community and creating partnerships in order to focus on, and ultimately address, a pressing issue.
- Similar or related terms include: community building, community engagement, coalition building, collective impact, etc.
- The underlying goal is to foster cooperation and resource sharing among community members, community organizations, and multiple sectors to facilitate positive change.




























































Pair and small group discussion

- 4. What did the monks do (or not do) that helped to mobilize the community?

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
Stone Soup lessons





Implications of the trajectory to safety

- 1. SDV are community issues.
- 2. SDV can be prevented. People can learn to be safe in their relationships when they are exposed to conditions that support safety.
- When people's needs are met (including opportunity, modeling/guidance, multi-generational healing), they can live in peaceful/nonviolent ways.
- Racial, economic, gender and other forms of equity in communities support greater safety and reduced SDV by giving more and more people equitable access to the conditions that support safety.
- 5. Creating equitable communities that support safety will require engagement of the multiple sectors that shape community conditions.
















Safety Through Connection Project
