Public Policy Advocacy

The Nebraska Coalition seeks to enhance Nebraska's response to sexual and domestic violence, human trafficking, and stalking and lead efforts to reduce and ultimately prevent these violent acts from occurring. This is accomplished by advocating for survivor–centered advocacy, the elimination of oppression, and comprehensive primary prevention programs, policies, and practices that examine and support efforts to prevent violence in all levels of society.

Survivor Support and Inclusion

The Nebraska Coalition was not created for the primary purpose of providing direct services for survivors. However, when a gap in services is identified by our member programs, we have the ability to provide support for their efforts. Therefore, immigration relief services, civil-legal assistance, and prison-based advocacy for sexual assault survivors is provided to assist our member programs.
