- Ensures the Coalition has the adequate resources and diversified funding available to support its mission, vision, and values, along with fulfilling the goals identified.
- Serves as the primary liaison between the BOD, team members, donors, Network of Member Programs, and funders.
- Provides capacity building support to Nebraska's Network of Member Programs and allied organizations.
